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



Ruby




Locally Crafted Beer



Castle & Museum Visit





Explore the Islands Many Vineyards


Funen is home to many of <u>Denmark's vineyards</u>. They invite visitors to tour the vineyards and of course taste the great wine.






A Winery Beyond the Ordinary
