

- The regions in Denmark are North, Mid, and South Jutland,
 Funen, Zealand, and North Zealand and Copenhagen
- Short distances: Copenhagen to Aalborg is a >5h drive.

Transportation

Bike, Bus, & Car

Go the Danish way and explore the country by bike. Many cities and hotels have bike rental services.

Busses are an easy way to get around the in cities.

We drive on the right-hand side, and everything is within driving distance. It is a 5-hour-drive from Copenhagen to Aalborg.

Trains

DSB (Danish National Rail) connects the major Danish cities. Metro and S-train makes travel in greater Copenhagen easy.

Ferries

Explore Copenhagen with the harbor busses. Ferries connect Zealand and Jutland. Flying

There are international airports in Aarhus,
Billund, Copenhagen, & Aalborg.
A different and fun way of traveling from
Copenhagen to Aarhus is via Nordic Seaplane.




Good to Know

- <u>Copenhagen Card</u> gives unlimited public transportation and access to all major attractions.
- Look to <u>CruiseCopenhagen</u> for cruise information.
- Sweden and Copenhagen are connected by bridge.
- Copenhagen Airport (CPH) is just 20 minutes from the city center.
- The historic city center is compact and very walkable - here you can easily walk to Tivoli Gardens, Nyhavn and Amalienborg where the royal family lives.





Top Attractions

København

- Enjoy the world's second-oldest amusement park of its kind, <u>Tivoli</u>
 <u>Gardens</u>. The oldest, <u>Bakken</u>, is just a short train ride from the city center.
- Visit the iconic Nyhavn and experience <u>Social Sailing by Hey Captain</u>. A
 relaxed canal tour led by local skippers who share stories and insights
 about the city through dialogue, all while taking in the views and perhaps
 a glass of wine.
- Explore the royal castles: <u>Amalienborg Palace</u>, home to the royal family, and <u>Rosenborg Castle</u>.
- Enjoy the city views from <u>The Round Tower</u> or the tower of <u>Christianborg</u>. <u>Palace</u>, home to the parliament.
- Stroll through <u>The Citadel</u> when you see the <u>Little Mermaid statue</u> and The Gefion Fountain.
- Do it the Danish way and go on a guided bike tour.
- Popular museums are <u>Glyptoteket</u>, <u>The National Gallery of Denmark</u>, and the National Museum of Denmark.
- Visit the many shops at <u>Strøget</u>, one of Europe's longest pedestrian streets.

- Vesterbro is home to the 'peoples house',
 <u>Absalon</u> church. Look up their activity
 calendar, join their daily communal dinners,
 or visit for a game of ping pong.
- In Frederiksberg, stop by to say hi to the animals in <u>Copenhagen Zoo</u>, explore the underground museum <u>Cisternerne</u>, and stroll Frederiksberg Gardens.



 On Refshaløen, you can ski, snowboard or climb all year round at <u>CopenHill</u>. Explore the art center <u>Copenhagen Contemporary</u> or have a memorable spa experience at <u>CopenHot</u>.



- In Nørrebro, you find the <u>Assistens Cemetery</u>, the resting place of fairytale writer H. C.
 Andersen and philosopher Søren Kierkegaard.
 It is also here you can experience the urban space of <u>Superkilen</u>.
- In Christianshavn, climb to the top of the <u>Church of Our Saviour</u> and stroll through the freetown of Christiania

Today, the city boasts a vibrant food scene that attracts Michelin stars, global recognition, and food lovers from around the world. From innovative fine dining to cozy street food markets, Copenhagen offers something for every palate and occasion.

- Enjoy traditional open-faced sandwiches at Schønemann or Aamanns 1921.
- Satisfy your sweet tooth at La Glace or Hart Bageri.
- For many options in one place, explore <u>Reffen</u>, <u>Broens Gadekøkken</u>, <u>Tivoli Food Hall</u>, and visit the cozy bars, restaurants, and cafés at <u>The Meatpacking District</u>, <u>Jægersborggade</u>, and <u>Blåggårdsgade</u>.
- Dine in beautiful surroundings at Restaurant Vækst.
- Treat yourself to a meal at Kiin Kiin the only Thai restaurant outside of Thailand with a Michelin star.
- Visit the world-famous restaurants Noma*** and Geranium***, the Best of the Best Restaurants in the World.
- Go for a nice meal, a drink, and a swim at the seafood restaurant and wine bar La Banchina.
- Try one of the restaurants from <u>Cofoco</u> (Copenhagen Food Collective), where they offer a wide range of different cuisines.
- Explore Foods of Copenhagen and plan the perfect food tour of the city.
- Experience the city's pulse and taste delicious dishes served directly from the Bicycle Chef's mobile kitchen.



Zealand Sjælland

Denmark's largest island is <u>Zealand</u>, located just across from Sweden. This vibrant region is home to the nation's capital, Copenhagen, as well as charming towns, scenic coastlines, and cultural landmarks. The waters south of Zealand are sprinkled with popular Danish vacation islands, offering a mix of sandy beaches, quaint villages, and outdoor activities for visitors of all ages.





Experiences Siælland

- Known as the castle of Shakespeare's Hamlet,
 Kronborg Castle is a Danish favorite. The castle is in the city of Elsinore, right next to M/S Maritime Museum.
- · Get inspired at the Louisiana Museum of Modern Art.
- Frederiksberg Castle and its baroque garden is perhaps the most beautiful castle in Denmark. Fredensborg Palace is Denmark's Versailles and is often the setting for official state visits and family events in the royal family.
- The city of <u>Roskilde</u> is home to <u>the Viking Ship Museum</u> and the beautiful <u>Roskilde Cathedral (UNESCO)</u>.
- · Take in the striking landscape views at Camp Adventure.
- Møns Klint is a great place for anyone who loves nature. With its unique sky and low light pollution, Møn was named the first Nordic Dark Sky Park and Community.

Experiences Bornholm


- The island's main city is beautiful <u>Rønne</u>. It has a lively harbor, and many explore the island from here on bikes or other great <u>outdoor activities</u>.
- One of the coziest towns is <u>Gudhjem</u> with its narrow streets and stone houses and it is famous the popular dishes "Sun over Gudhjem".
- Visit the largest castle ruin in Northern Europe, <u>Hammershus</u>. It feels like stepping onto a Games of Thrones set, without the violence of course.
- Bornholm has great <u>culinary experiences</u>. <u>Smoked herring</u> is a specialty.
- Take the ferry to <u>Christiansø</u> and see the 350-year-old fortress.
- Spend the night on a boat by <u>Varra Water</u>, where visitors can enjoy nature experiences the island's nature and embraces its rich maritime culture.
- Bornholm Food Tours offers guided food and nature tours on the island.

Funen & Islands Fyn & øerne

<u>Funen</u> is fine – as the Danes say. This bike-friendly island is known for its gently rolling hills, fertile countryside dotted with fruit orchards, and charming towns. Its surrounding <u>archipelago</u> of 93 islands offers hidden coves, scenic harbors, and plenty of spots to enjoy the nature. And, of course, it's the birthplace of the world-famous fairy-tale writer H.C. Andersen, so a little magic is never far away.

Fyn & øerne

- Odense is Funen's largest city and the birthplace of the fairy tale writer, H. C. Andersen. Exploring the cobbled streets of his childhood and the museum, H.C. Andersen's House, is like taking a step back in time. Learn about Odense's gastronomy scene here.
- · Visit the old market town of Faaborq.
- Walk through the gardens, get lost in the maze, and explore the beautiful chambers at <u>Egeskov Castle</u>.
- · Across the bridge from <u>Svendborg</u> you can explore <u>Valdemar Castle</u>.
- Island hopping in the Archipelago and visit Ærø is one of the most beloved Danish islands, and it is the perfect place to wound down and meet the locals.

UNESCO Sites Sønderjylland

- With its straight rectangular streets and the large church in the center of the city, <u>Christiansfeld</u> was and is still unique, and it is the best-preserved city of its kind in the world.
- The Wadden Sea is one of the world's top ten tidal flats and in low tide, it is a great place to go on Oyster Safari and experience black sun.
- The Jelling Monuments, close to Vejle, have enjoyed UNESCO World Heritage patronage since 1994. In the visitor and experience center, Kongernes Jelling, you can discover the exciting world of the Vikings and their monuments.





East Jutland

Midtjylland

The Mid Jutland region offers both the beautiful lake district around Silkeborg, often called Denmark's outdoor capital, and the dramatic coastline of Djursland. Scattered across the region are also historic market towns showcasing local culture and traditions. At its center lies Denmark's second largest city, <u>Aarhus</u>, with a vibrant gastro scene, bold architecture, and a cozy Latin Quarter.

Denmark's second largest city, Aarhus, offers a mix of youthful energy, rich history, and topclass museums

- Look <u>here</u> for places to stay in Aarhus.
- Aarhus has an amazing gastro-scene with great restaurants and a vibrant street food market.
- Explore modern art at <u>AROS</u> and take a trip to the museums roof and visit <u>Your Rainbow Panorama</u>.
- Take a step back in time at <u>The Old Town</u>
 <u>Museum</u>, an openair museum in the city center right next to the botanical garden.
- Just outside the Aarhus you find <u>Moesgaard</u>
 <u>Museum</u>, an attraction dedicated to archaeology and ethnography.
- <u>Aarhus Island (Aarhus Ø)</u> is a new and upcoming part of town and home to the city's harbor bath.
- Visit the culture- and multimedia house <u>Dokk'l</u>.
- The infinity Bridge is now permanently back by popular demand.

ExperiencesMidtjylland

- The idyllic coastal town of <u>Ebeltoft</u> is known for its cute cobble stoned streets, and its many cafes, restaurants, and shops.
- <u>Gudenåen</u> is Denmark's longest river, and it extends through an experience-rich landscape. Trips on the river are ideally started from the city of <u>Silkeborg</u>. You can explore the river onboard <u>Hjejlen</u> - the world's oldest original coal-fired paddle steamer.
- Experience the <u>Mols Bjerge National Park</u> and visit
 the nearby ruined <u>Kalø Castle</u>.
- Visit the mine tunnels, their history, and beautiful nature of <u>Mønsted Kalkgruber</u>.












North Jutland Nordjylland

The wild and wonderful <u>northern tip of Jutland</u> is home to deserts and buried monuments created by the region's ever-shifting sands. Along the rugged coastline, you'll also find small, charming fishing villages with colorful harbors reflecting the region's deep maritime heritage. The city of <u>Aalborg</u> adds a modern contrast as a vibrant cultural hotspot with a spectacular waterfront.





Aalborg Nordjylland

Aalborg, the main city of North Jutland, is often called 'the Paris of the North,' as it blends historic charm with a lively cultural scene.

- The beautiful <u>Utzon Center</u> at <u>Aalborg's waterfront</u> hosts different exhibits throughout the year and presents sketches and designs by Aalborg-born architect Jørn Utzon, famous architect of the Sydney Opera House.
- <u>Kunsten Museum of Modern Art Aalborg</u> is like a sculpture growing out of the greenery around it to create a beautiful frame for world-class art.
- Explore <u>Aalborg Monastery's</u> special history and how it has functioned since 1431.
- House of Music (Musikkens Hus) is an architectonic lighthouse of Aalborg and North Jutland and a national and international rendezvous of music.
- · The cute preserved houses at Hjelmerstald.
- · Hotels and restaurants in Aalborg.













Experiences Nordjylland

- <u>Klitmøller</u> is famous for its fantastic windsurfing and surfing conditions. It is also known as Cold Hawaii.
- Regan Vest(Link in Danish) was built to house the Danish Royal family and government during the Cold War.
- · Take <u>surfing lessons</u> in the beach town of <u>Løkken</u>.
- The <u>Rubjerg Knude Lighthouse</u> from 1900 is a jaw-dropping visit. Its location on high dunes makes it in danger of falling into the ocean.
- The island of <u>Læsø</u> is famous for its <u>seaweed roofs</u>, <u>saltworks</u>, <u>Læsø Kur</u>
 spa resort, its outstanding nature, and great food.
- Explore the fishing village of <u>Skagen</u> with its characteristic yellow houses and go to the northernmost point in continental Europe at <u>Grenen</u>, where two seas collide.
- Stay at one of Denmark's iconic <u>Seaside Hotels</u>.

Klitmøller (Cold Hawaii)

The seaside town welcomes many visitors each year and is both a perfect getaway with its cozy holiday homes as well as one of the best spots for surfing in Denmark.



Grenen, Skagen

At the very top of Denmark, Skagen offers a truly unique experience where you can stand with one foot in each sea.



Løkken Beach

A historic coastal town where white wooden beach huts meet the sea, and World War II bunkers dot the wide sandy beaches.

Venø


Reach <u>Venø</u>, which is part of <u>UNESCO Geopark</u> <u>Vestjylland</u>, with <u>Denmark's shortest ferry ride</u>. The island is known for its <u>delicous seafood</u>, having <u>Danmark's smallest church</u>, and for its beautiful nature.

Fur

<u>Fur</u> is known for its excellent <u>fossil hunting</u> opportunities and some of the many fossil discoveries can be explored at <u>Fur Museum</u>. Meet the locals and enjoy <u>the local cuisine</u>. Be sure to include a visit to Fur Brewery.

Mors

The biggest island in the Limfjord, Mors, is known for the dramatic moler cliffs that shows 55 million years of history. The island has delicious shellfish and in you can join the island's Shellfish Festival in June every year.
